

BREEAM credits for Japanese Knotweed removal

The proper remediation of Japanese Knotweed infestation can earn one credit in the BREEAM assessment of a project (Land Use & Ecology LE2 - Contaminated land Category).

To qualify, the site must be deemed to be significantly contaminated in a specialist's site investigation report, and the remediation must be carried out in accordance with the specialist's remediation strategy and implementation plan. Your BREEAM Assessor will need to gather suitable evidence to confirm compliance with the credit criteria.

A GroundCoverDBM Japanese Knotweed report will provide the evidence needed to meet the Design Stage requirement. On completion of our site works, we will provide a verification report suitable for the Post-construction Stage requirement.
